John T. McNabb II is Founder and Chairman of the Board of Directors of Growth Capital Partners, L.P. He has held this position since March 1992. Previously, he was a Managing Director and Board member of BT Southwest Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of Bankers Trust New York Corporation. Mr. McNabb came to Bankers Trust from The Prudential Insurance Company of America where he had a six-year career, commencing in 1984, in positions with Prudential-Bache Securities, The Prudential's Corporate Finance Group and Prudential Capital Corporation, a merchant banking affiliate of The Prudential. In Mr. McNabb's last position with Prudential Capital, he was responsible for a multi-billion-dollar investment portfolio of debt and equity securities. He started his career with Mobil Oil in its exploration and production division in Colorado and Texas.

Mr. McNabb holds BA and MBA degrees from Duke University. He is a shareholder and Director of GCP Securities, Inc. and a shareholder and Chairman of the Board of Willbros Group ("WG" – NYSE). He is also a shareholder and director of Hiland Partners, LP ("HLND" – NASDAQ); JAG Flocomponents, LP (Edmonton, Alberta, Canada); The Integrated Service Company, LLC; Miocene Energy, LLC; Premier Natural Resources and a shareholder and Advisory Committee Member of FEC Holdings, L.P. In addition, Mr. McNabb is an emeritus member of the Board of Visitors of the Fuqua School of Business at Duke University and Past Chairman of the Dean's Executive Board of the Bauer College of Business at the University of Houston, where he has developed and taught a course in Leadership.

Mr. McNabb has served on a total of six public company boards listed on the NYSE, AMEX, and NASDAQ. He also served in the U.S. Air Force during the Vietnam conflict, rising to the rank of Captain and was awarded the Air Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters and the Distinguished Flying Cross as a result of combat operations in Southeast Asia.
