## A. 1 Cost of Misreporting Depends on $(r-y)$ Instead of $(r-q)$

The cost of misreporting could be a function of $(r-y)^{2}$ instead of $(r-q)^{2}$. One reason is that $y$ is observable (eventually), while $q$ is not. Such a cost would be uncertain, since the realization of $y$ is uncertain. We could model the cost of misreporting as $\frac{\kappa_{1}}{2}(r-E[y])^{2}+\frac{\kappa_{2}}{2} E\left[(r-y)^{2}\right]$ (the first term can easily be omitted), which can be rewritten as

& =\frac{\kappa_{1}}{2}(r-q)^{2}+\frac{\kappa_{2}}{2}\left(\int_{-\infty}^{\infty}(r-q)^{2} f(\varepsilon) d \varepsilon-\int_{-\infty}^{\infty}(2(r-q) \varepsilon) f(\varepsilon) d \varepsilon+\int_{-\infty}^{\infty} \varepsilon^{2} f(\varepsilon) d \varepsilon\right) \\
& =\frac{\kappa_{1}}{2}(r-q)^{2}+\frac{\kappa_{2}}{2}\left((r-q)^{2}-2(r-q) E[\varepsilon]+\int_{-\infty}^{\infty} \varepsilon^{2} f(\varepsilon) d\right) \\
& =\frac{\kappa_{1}}{2}(r-q)^{2}+\frac{\kappa_{2}}{2}\left((r-q)^{2}-0+\sigma_{\varepsilon}^{2}\right) \\
& =\frac{\kappa_{1}+\kappa_{2}}{2}(r-q)^{2}+\frac{\kappa_{2}}{2} \sigma_{\varepsilon}^{2} .
\end{aligned}
$$

Now consider a compensation contract $\widehat{w}=(\widehat{\alpha}, \widehat{\beta}, \widehat{\delta})$ such that $\widehat{\alpha}=\alpha+\frac{\kappa_{2}}{2} \sigma^{2} ; \widehat{\beta}=\beta+\xi ; \widehat{\delta}=\delta-\xi$; and $\kappa_{1}+\kappa_{2}=c$. The CEO's expected payoff would be

& =E[\widehat{\alpha}+\widehat{\beta} r+\widehat{\delta} y-\xi(r-y)]-\frac{\rho}{2} \operatorname{Var}(\widehat{\alpha}+\widehat{\beta} r+\widehat{\delta} y-\xi(r-y))-\frac{g}{2} L^{2}-\frac{\kappa_{1}+\kappa_{2}}{2}(r-q)^{2}-\frac{\kappa_{2}}{2} \sigma^{2} \\
& =E[\widehat{\alpha}+\beta r+\delta y]-\frac{\rho}{2} \operatorname{Var}(\widehat{\alpha}+\beta r+\delta y)-\frac{g}{2} L^{2}-\frac{\kappa_{1}+\kappa_{2}}{2}(r-q)^{2}-\frac{\kappa_{2}}{2} \sigma^{2} \\
& =E\left[\widehat{\alpha}-\frac{\kappa_{2}}{2} \sigma^{2}+\beta r+\delta y\right]-\frac{\rho}{2} \operatorname{Var}(\widehat{\alpha}+\beta r+\delta y)-\frac{g}{2} L^{2}-\frac{\kappa_{1}+\kappa_{2}}{2}(r-q)^{2} \\
& =\widehat{\alpha}-\frac{\kappa_{2}}{2} \sigma^{2}+\beta r+\delta \cdot E[y]-\frac{\rho}{2} \delta^{2} \sigma^{2}-\frac{g}{2} L^{2}-\frac{\kappa_{1}+\kappa_{2}}{2}(r-q)^{2} \\
& =\alpha+\beta r+\delta E[y]-\frac{\rho}{2} \sigma^{2} \delta-\frac{g}{2} L^{2}-\frac{c}{2}(r-q)^{2},
\end{aligned}
$$

which is the payoff described in equation (4). Thus, our assumption that the cost of misreporting depends on $(r-q)$ is equivalent to assuming that it depends on $(r-y)$.

## A. 2 Derivation of the Incentive Constraints, (10) and (11)

The incentive constraints are

& +\left(\alpha_{\ell}+\frac{\beta_{\ell}^{2}}{2 c}-\frac{\rho \sigma^{2}}{2} \delta_{\ell}^{2}+\frac{\left(\beta_{\ell}+\delta_{\ell}\right)^{2}}{2 g} \tau_{h}^{2}\right)  \tag{A5}\\

## A. 3 Proof of Lemma 1

The benevolent planner's objective function is (3). The first-order conditions are

Combine the two first-order conditions and solve for $\beta$ and $\delta$, to obtain $\beta_{i}^{*}$ and $\delta_{i}^{*}$.
The lowest-rent implementation sets $\alpha_{\ell}$ such that the low-talent participation constraint (9) is
binding, which can be solved for $\alpha_{\ell}^{*}$,

The incentive constraints (10) and (11) can be rewritten as (replacing $U\left(\tau_{\ell}, w_{\ell}^{*}\right)=0$ )

The high-talent incentive constraint is binding, while the low-talent incentive constraint is slack. The surplus generated by a low-talent CEO is (using (3))

The large fraction equals $\frac{1}{\delta_{i}^{*}}$; replace, and simplify, to obtain

The surplus is thus strictly positive if a low-talent CEO is hired. Since with $\alpha_{\ell}=\alpha_{\ell}^{*}$ a low-talent CEO's expected net payoff is zero, this implies that the firm's profit is strictly positive if it hires a low-talent CEO. Similarly, a high-talent CEO's surplus under the contract $w_{h}^{*}$ is

Since $\delta_{h}^{*}>\delta_{\ell}^{*}$ and $\tau_{h}>\tau_{\ell}$, this implies that $S\left(\tau_{h}, w_{h}^{*}\right)>S\left(\tau_{\ell}, w_{\ell}^{*}\right)$, so a benevolent planner wants both CEO types to be active.

A high-talent CEO's expected payoff is (using $\beta_{i}^{*}=c \sigma^{2} \rho \cdot \delta_{i}^{*}$, (5), (12) and (A8))

A high-talent CEO's expected payoff is smaller than the surplus she generates (cf. (A11)), and thus the firm's profit is positive, if

That is satisfied, since

So the firm's profit is positive if it hires a high-talent CEO.
There exists a continuum of contracts that implement the efficient outcome. They are found by increasing $\alpha_{\ell}$ and $\alpha_{h}$ such that the ICs remain satisfied. The upper bound to the set of efficient contracts is where a low-talent CEO extracts all the surplus she generates. That is the case if her
expected payoff (cf. (5)),

and simplify to obtain

(The firm's profit then equals zero.) Incentive compatibility is maintained if $\alpha_{h}$ is increased, such that $\alpha_{h}^{* *} \geq \alpha_{h}^{*}+\left(\alpha_{\ell}^{* *}-\alpha_{\ell}^{*}\right)$ without violating the low-talent incentive constraint, (11). The highest feasible $\alpha_{h}^{* *}$ is thus defined by $\alpha_{\ell}=\alpha_{\ell}^{* *}$ and a binding incentive constraint for a low-talent CEO,

Solve for $\alpha_{h}^{* *}$, to obtain

The firms' equilibrium contract is defined by the program (14)-(16). A high-talent CEO's decisions must be distorted, since as shown above, the set of efficient contracts is incentive compatible but leads to positive profits for the firm. Clearly, one of the incentive constraints (15) and (16) must be binding: If not, the distortion in a high-talent CEO's decisions could be mitigated, increasing the surplus she generates. As before, we ignore one of the incentive constraints and assume that the other is binding. However, as we will show, the binding constraint is the low-talent incentive constraint (16). (The low-talent incentive constraint is slack in the equilibrium contract in the single-firm setup.)

With a binding low-talent incentive constraint (16), and ignoring the high-talent incentive constraint (15), we can rewrite the firms' optimization program as a Lagrangian:

The remainder of this proof shows that there are no profitable deviation strategies for the firms. A deviation contract is one of the following: (1) a separating contract that a low-talent CEO accepts and a high-talent CEO rejects; (2) a separating contract that a high-talent CEO accepts and
a low-talent CEO rejects; or (3) a pooling contract that both types accept. (A profitable deviation to separating contracts that both types accept is not feasible, since by construction, the postulated equilibrium separating contract is the optimal separating contract.)

The first deviation cannot be profitable: Under the equilibrium contract, a low-talent CEO generates the highest possible surplus and fully extracts it. Any departures from that contract are either rejected, or they lead to losses for the firm.

The second deviation consists of a contract that a high-talent CEO accepts but a low-talent CEO rejects. Say, the deviation contract offered to a high-talent CEO is $w_{d}=\left(\alpha_{d}, \beta_{d}, \delta_{d}\right)$. A high-talent CEO prefers the deviation contract $w_{d}$ to the separating contract $w_{h}^{c}$ if $U\left(\tau_{h}, w_{d}\right)>U\left(\tau_{h}, w_{h}^{c}\right)$, i.e., if (cf. (5))

Since her incentive constraint (16) is binding, that holds if $U\left(\tau_{\ell}, w_{h}^{c}\right) \geq U\left(\tau_{\ell}, w_{d}\right)$, i.e., if

That requires $\left(\beta_{d}+\delta_{d}\right)>\left(\beta_{h}^{c}+\delta_{h}^{c}\right)$, i.e., a distortion of a high-talent CEO's incentives worse than under the separating contract. (We show in the proof of Corollary 4 (below) that $\delta_{h}^{c} \geq \delta_{h}^{*}$, which implies $\beta_{h}^{c}>\beta_{h}^{*}$.) But such a contract reduces the surplus that a high-talent CEO generates, and thus the rent she can extract. It would not be accepted, unless it violates the firm's break-even constraint, which would make the deviation unattractive to the firm.

The third possible deviation is to a pooling contract that both CEO types accept. Such a deviation pooling contract is feasible if $p_{h}$ is sufficiently large, which leads to the equilibrium existence condition $p_{h} \leq p_{o}$. The upper bound $p_{o}$ is the value of $p_{h}$ at which the firm breaks even, and a high-talent CEO is indifferent between the equilibrium contract $w_{h}^{c}$ and the deviation pooling contract $w_{\text {pool }}^{d}$. Such a deviation pooling contract $w_{\text {pool }}^{d}$ must maximize a high-talent CEO's expected payoff, such that she prefers this contract to the separating equilibrium contract, such that a low-talent CEO also prefers the deviation pooling contract, and such that the firm breaks even on average

The reason for focusing on maximizing a high-talent CEO's payoff under the deviation pooling contract is that a low-talent CEO prefers a pooling deviation contract $w_{\text {pool }}^{d}$ to her separating equilibrium contract $w_{\ell}^{c}$ (i.e., $\left.U\left(\tau_{\ell}, w_{p o o l}^{d}\right)>U\left(\tau_{\ell}, w_{\ell}^{c}\right)\right)$ if a high-talent CEO weakly prefers $w_{p o o l}^{d}$ to her equilibrium contract $w_{h}^{c}$ (i.e., $\left.U\left(\tau_{h}, w_{\text {pool }}^{d}\right) \geq U\left(\tau_{h}, w_{h}^{c}\right)\right)$ : Using (5),

Now we can state the result: If $z \geq \bar{z}$, then $\Delta S\left(p_{h}\right) \leq 0$ for all $p_{h} \in[0,1]$. Now, fix any $z \geq \bar{z}$. Since $p_{o}(z) \in(0,1)$, if $p_{h} \leq p_{o}(z)$ then the competitive equilibrium exists and it's weakly less efficient than the single firm equilibrium.

By continuity, the same result holds for small $c>0$. The results $\Delta S(0)=0$ and $\Delta S(1)<0$ hold generally, for any $c$. Next,

The distortion in the single-firm setup becomes extreme, but the expected value of the lost surplus goes to zero as $p_{h}$ grows. For these examples, $\Delta_{w}^{c}-\Delta_{w}^{s f}$ is positive if $c$ is sufficiently small, and negative if $p_{h}$ and $c$ are sufficiently large. However, this effect does not hold for all parameter

However, at that value, $U\left(\tau_{h}, w_{p o o l}^{d}\right)$ is decreasing in $p_{h}$, which is inconsistent with the contract being feasible. As shown above (see the text around equation (A50)), $U\left(\tau_{h}, w_{p o o l}^{d}\right)$ is increasing in $p_{h}$ in the range where pooling deviation contracts are feasible. As is easily confirmed, with very high values of $p_{0}, \delta_{\text {pool }}^{d}$ is close to $\delta_{h}^{*}$; in contrast, the distortion in $\delta_{h}^{c}$ does not depend on $p_{h}$. So for very high values of $p_{h}$, we must have $U\left(\tau_{h}, w_{p o o l}^{d}\right)>U\left(\tau_{h}, w_{h}^{c}\right)$, and the solution in which the square root is added is the relevant cut-off for $E_{i}\left[\tau_{i}^{2}\right]$.
