As part of the RED Labs summer program, the objective of this course is for you to learn entrepreneurship by actually doing it. Over the summer, you will be immersed in a true startup experience: working with a cohort of founders, refining a business model, developing a product, and launching a tech startup.

REFLECTIONS PAPER.

A significant portion of your grade is determined by your reflections paper, which is due on the last day of the program. The outline for the reflections paper will be shared later in the summer.

FOUNDERS MEETINGS.

Held once a week during the summer program. The intention is to reflect upon the learning, challenges and achievements each week, to support each other and give feedback, and for both RED Labs and the other startups to understand where you are at and how they can help.

MENTORSHIP MEETINGS.

You are expected to meet with a mentor at least once a week to discuss the progress of your business.

BAYOU STARTUP SHOWCASE.

RED Labs + OwlSpark will be hosting the fourth annual Bayou Startup Showcase. You are expected to attend the entire event, help your team with the showcase portion of the event that is held after the pitches, and network with event guests.

TECH ENTREPRENEURSHIP CERTIFICATE.

A tech entrepreneurship certificate can be obtained by completing this course and one additional course, either: Intro to Tech Entrepreneurship (ENTR 3311 / ENTR 7390) or the Pre-Accelerator (ENTR 4393 / ENTR 7393).
